#### I INTRODUCTION

Delhi, capital city of India, has a population of around 1.67 crore as per Census 2011 with an area of 1,483 KM². The projected population during 2021 is around 2.00 crores. Delhi has a very sound economy which is mostly led by the service sector (around 83% of GSVA coming from service sector activities), grew at an average growth rate of 5.28% during last 06 years at constant price. In terms of per capita income, Delhi figured in one of the top three positions in the country alongwith Goa and Sikkim with per capita income of ₹ 3.54 lakh in 2020-21, which is about three times of national per capita income. The per capita expenditure of Government of NCT of Delhi through budgetary transactions has constantly been increasing from ₹18844 in 2015-16 to ₹ 25506 in 2020-21 with focus on social welfare and social security schemes. Priority is on continuous improvement of public services delivery in the field of education and healthcare and increasing the purchasing power of targeted beneficiaries through subsidies on water and electricity, social welfare and social security measures.

It is one of the top priority of Government of NCT of Delhi that all its citizens are treated equally and equitably in sharing the benefit of high growth and development process through inclusive development on the key principle: "No one is left behind". Government has been thriving consistently in this direction to make the progress sufficiently widespread for the majority of population in the City State so that it can reach out to the last person standing in the stair among the marginal and under privileged sections of the society. State is also mandated by the Constitution to give Social Security as per the Directive Principles of State Policy and the State shall, within the limits of its economic capacity and development, is to make effective provision for securing the right to work, to education and to public assistance to address the issues pertains to unemployment, old age, sickness, disablement etc. Specifically, Article 46 of the Constitution states that "The State shall promote with special care the educational and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people, and, in particular, of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, and shall protect them from social injustice and all forms of exploitation." whereas the Article 47 emphasize that "The State shall regard the raising of the level of nutrition and the standard of living of its people and the improvement of public health as among its primary duties and, in particular, the State shall endeavour to bring about prohibition of the consumption except for medicinal purposes of intoxicating drinks and of drugs which are injurious to health." The ultimate objective of the Government is to provide social welfare and ensure well being of citizens.

Govt. of NCT of Delhi has a large number of welfare programmes/schemes to cater to the need of weaker and marginal sections of the society. There are around 71 Schemes implemented by the Departments of GNCTD/Agencies (including 13 Centrally Sponsored Schemes) with the total Budget allocation of Rs. 9087.69 Crore for specific targeted groups/beneficiaries in different fields covering education, health, social security and welfare measures. The eligibility criteria / norm for availing benefit quantum of financial assistance or benefits given, either in cash or in kind under these welfare schemes /programmes, expenditure incurred in 2020-21 and Budget estimate for 2021-22 etc. are presented in the report. Subsidized power and water, coupled with increased state spending on public services such as health and education has proved to be really beneficial in improving economic and social status of the people in Delhi.

The document presents an overview of all welfare schemes intended to give benefits in cash or kind to poor/ weaker and marginal sections viz. Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Minorities, differently-abled etc. including women empowerment. In some schemes there is decline in number of beneficiaries in 2020-21 due to COVID 19 pandemic while on the other hand, it is worthwhile to mention that some schemes have supported the needy families in the hard time of COVID-19 pandemic, besides several other one time measures.

Most of the schemes compiled in this document are for the welfare of weaker sections but some schemes are available for all the citizens of Delhi. The schemes like water & electricity subsidy are mainly targeted towards weaker sections but can also be availed by general citizens of Delhi. The major beneficiaries of such schemes are from weaker section of society.


